Wendell Rider

Wendell Rider was Principal Horn with the San Jose Symphony from 1970 until its demise in 2002. He has also been Principal Horn with the Midsummer Mozart Festival Orchestra, the Bear Valley Music Festival, the Monterey County Symphony and the Monterey Bay Symphony.

He attended the Eastman School of Music and studied with Verne Reynolds. Other teachers include Charles Bubb Jr., Ralph Hotz, and Philip Farkas and Arnold Jacobs of the Chicago Symphony. Mr. Rider currently teaches horn at Santa Clara University and has also taught at UC Santa Cruz. He is also a founding member of the popular brass and percussion group “Brass Plus” (featuring members of the San Jose Symphony), the Woodwind Quintet “RedWoodWinds”, and is heard frequently around the San Francisco Bay Area as a recitalist and soloist.

Mr. Rider has soloed with the San Jose Symphony, Monterey Symphony, Monterey Bay Symphony and Midsummer Mozart. He started teaching horn at age 15 when he was principal with the California Youth Symphony. He has many students playing professionally, some as principals, in orchestras all over the world.

He has heard and judged literally thousands of auditions for San Jose Symphony and other organizations. He has coached students and professionals on different instruments for student and professional auditions.

Recently, Mr. Rider became one of the first teachers to give lessons over the internet using video conferencing.

Scott Hartman

Scott L. Hartman is one of the Bay Area’s busiest horn players. Mr. Hartman has performed in every horn chair in the San Jose and Santa Cruz symphonies, Opera San Jose, AMT, SJ/Cleveland Ballet. He has also performed with the San Francisco Symphony, Merola Opera, Midsummer Mozart, Moscow Chamber Orchestra, Monterey Symphony and California Symphony. His performances range from recording Lou Harrison’s music for Horn and Gamelan to TV commercials to performing with Luciano Pavarotti to rock concerts at the Cow Palace. He is a first call player with Symphony Silicon Valley, the Pacific Chamber Orchestra and is a founding member of the Silicon Valley Brass Quintet.

Mr. Hartman teaches in his home and is on the staff of the University of Santa Clara. In 2004 and 2005 1/6 of the horns in the CBDA State Honor Bands were his students. He is the brass coach for the El Camino Youth Orchestra and coaches regularly at several area high schools. He was a guest artist and lecturer at the International Horn Society’s Western US Symposium in Las Vegas in 2002.

Mr. Hartman attended SJSU and the Universidad Politecnico in Mexico City. His horn teachers include two principal horns of the SF Symphony and two from the NY Philharmonic. Before becoming a full time horn player and teacher in 1998, he had been a kitchen designer, newspaper publisher, cooked in a French restaurant and was a manager at Apple Computer.
